Drawings that are usually intended to be read as much as to be looked at, cartoons, caricatures and comics can be as important and influential a part of the overall popular culture as movies, music and theatre. Whatever way you choose to view them, there’ll be no shortage of thought-provoking, guffaw-inducing, gloriously silly, and sometimes shocking material to be perused at this year’s Galway Cartoon Festival.

This year’s Festival is themed ‘Drawing the Line’. We have a strong literary flavor with ‘James Joyce Remembered’ — a unique exhibition of illustrations from *Ulysses* alongside a selection of different portraits of one of our most notorious novelists. There’s also an illustrated talk of the little-known comic strip art of Jack B. Yeats, a retrospective of the surreal scribbles of Tom Mathews, a series of workshops by famed French caricaturist Fabrice Matray, a solo show by renowned Dublin cartoonist Jim Cogan, an Irish-language themed cartoon exhibition, and much more besides.

As always, the festival will be happening all across the city — in the pubs, the library, the theatres, the shop windows, the streets, out on Inis Óirr ... and in the very air.

Time to draw the line under the last couple of miserable years, and start having some festive fun again. Enjoy!

Each year, we host a solo show by one of Ireland's top cartoonists. This year we feature the work of Jim Cogan who began his career drawing cartoons for *Hibernia* magazine while he was still a student at the National College of Art and Design.



After spending a number of years in the Art Departments of various advertising agencies, Jim eventually became a full-time cartoonist and illustrator working mainly for *The Sunday Independent* and *The Irish Farmers Journal*. He is very highly-regarded as a caricaturist and his covers for *The Phoenix Annual* every year will be familiar to many.



MARILENA NARDI 'THE CARTOONS OF TOMORROW'

A teacher of illustration and anatomical drawing at the Academy of Fine Arts in Venice, Marilena Nardi combines her extraordinary skill with a rich imagination to create some of the most powerful cartooning work in Europe today. Her many accolades include winning both the Editorial Cartoon category (becoming the first woman to do so) and the overall Grand Prix at the World Press Cartoon Awards in 2018.

Having appeared in many major publications including *Corriere della Sera* and *Le Monde*, she now contributes regularly to Italian national *Domani* (*Tomorrow*).



JAMES JOYCE EXHIBITION

ULYSSES 'PARIS 1922 GALWAY 2022'

Galway Mechanics Institute, Middle Street

This exhibition displays twenty chosen works commissioned by M. Savelli; three of which are portraits of James Joyce and seventeen of which are illustrated operas depicting various sections of *Ulysses*. Simone Nevolo is the main artist and other artists also took part in the main initial project.

M. Savelli is the author of a book entitled *Easy Ulysses (Relatively) - Guida alle Adventure dei personaggi di Ulysses nella Dublino di James Joyce* which translates as *Easy Ulysses (Relatively) - A Guide to the Adventures of the characters of Ulysses in the Dublin of James Joyce*.

To celebrate the Centennial of the publication of *Ulysses*, Bernardino Savelli suggested to Mr. Marco Giacobini, Director of the Italian Institute of Culture in Ireland to present the commissioned pieces to the public for the very first time; *Easy Ulysses (Relatively)*.

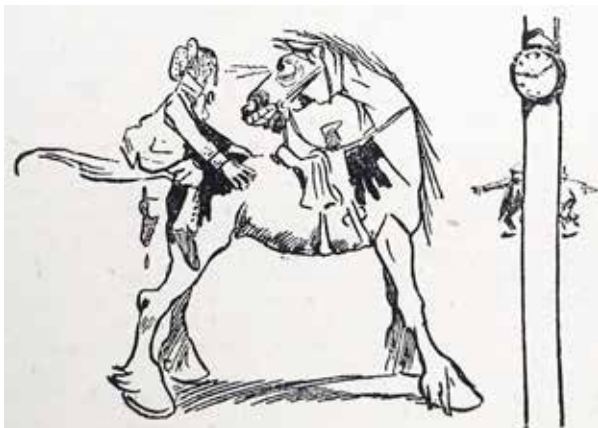


THE COMIC STRIP ART OF JACK B YEATS

An Taibhdherac, Middle Street
Sunday 2nd October at 4:00pm

Before he found fame as a painter, becoming one of the most significant Irish artists of the 20th century, Jack B. Yeats had a long and successful career as a cartoonist and comic strip artist, contributing to some of the most popular titles in the first British comics boom of the late Victorian period and beyond. He originated many characters, including the detective parody Chubblock Homes, Signor McCoy the circus horse, and an educated monkey called Lickity Switch, each of whose slapstick adventures were read by hundreds of thousands of people every week. Michael Connerty, author of *The Comic Strip Art of Jack B. Yeats*, will give an illustrated talk on this little known aspect of Yeats's career and early comic strip history.

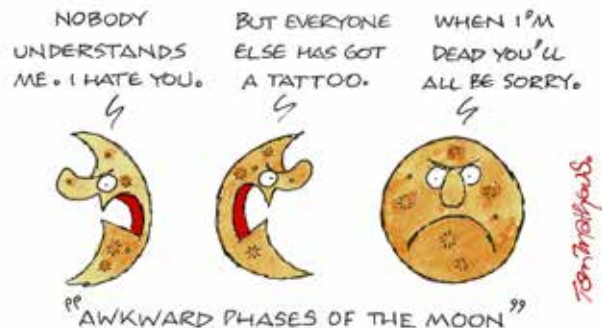

GALWAY CITY MAP

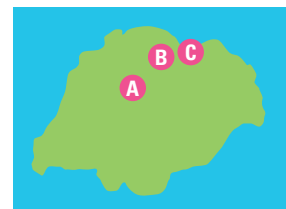
